WHAT IS SIGNATURE WORK?

WHAT IS SIGNATURE WORK?

Large, individually-designed project that DKU students plan in Junior year and finish in Senior year - like a senior thesis

KEY ELEMENTS

- Planned and executed with and evaluated by DKU faculty **Mentor(s)**
- 3 **thematic** courses followed by 8 credits of **Capstone** courses
 1. **Proposal** due spring of Junior year
 2. **Products** (Paper etc.) and **Portfolio** (documentation) due spring of Senior year
 3. **Presentation** at end of year (SWCE)

CURRENT SOPHOMORES

Figure out your **major** first!

Once you've decided, begin asking yourself:

- What kind of **project** related to my major might I want to work on?
- What **3 (thematic) courses** at DKU or Duke might help me learn the background/methodologies/etc. I will need?
- What DKU faculty member (**mentor**) works in my field? How can we get to know each other?

CURRENT JUNIORS (1 OF 3)

Before you advance, you'll need to identify a **research question** - that is, a *question* in your field that you'll devise a *method* solve.

Common approaches to finding a question include:

- Identify a **gap in knowledge** - some data/information not currently known. Often found in the natural sciences.
- Identify a **paradigm problem** - aspects of theories, beliefs, or understandings that are inconsistent, inadequate, etc. Often found in the humanities.

CURRENT JUNIORS (2 OF 3)

Your main task for this year is the **SW Proposal**. Work with your **mentor** (who signs it) to figure out the broad shape of your project:

- Project title, focus, key words, intended product, bibliography
- Responsible Conduct of Research (**RCR**) Certification
- Institutional Review Board (**IRB**) and Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (**IACUC**) if needed

CURRENT JUNIORS (3 OF 3)

Also plan your **capstones** with your mentor:

- When will you take them? Consider the needs of your project and other curricular needs
- What will you *do* during your capstones? Broadly 495 is for research and 496 for writing. How specifically will you divide your time? When will your milestones be?
- **Make a plan** for regular meetings, expected progress, deadlines, etc.

CURRENT SENIORS

Following your plan, execute (most) of your research during Capstone 495 and write (or finish) your paper etc. during Capstone 496

Submit your final products and portfolio by
March 9th

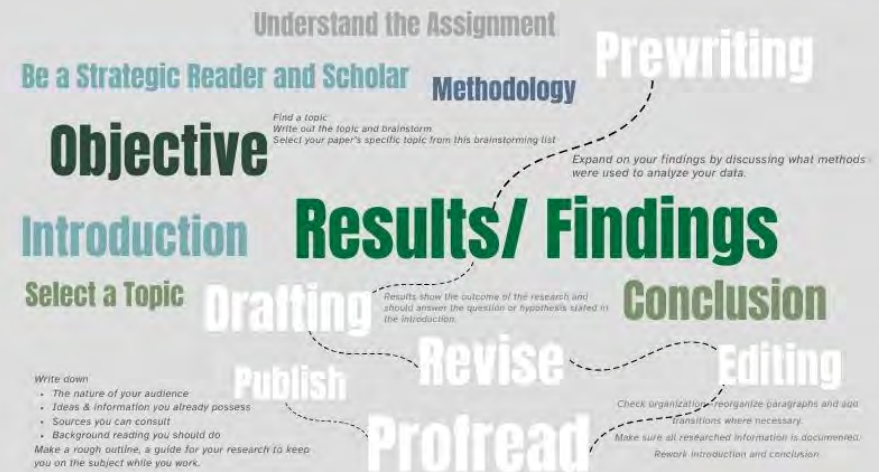

SELF: Student Experiential Learning Fellowship

If you find an opportunity that makes sense, then SELF is designed to help make it a reality, but it must support the Signature Work project.

Student prepares proposal and applies directly to the program

SRS: Summer Research Scholars

Research stipends for students to engage in a collaborative summer research project with a faculty mentor.

Faculty member writes a proposal and applies to SRS
教职人员编写提案并提交SRS项目申请

Students express interest directly to the faculty
学生直接向教职人员表达兴趣

Funds a summer stipend, not equipment

Summer on campus housing is budget free
夏季校园住房费用免费

Requires Report AND Poster Session in Fall

Standard Award: 5,600 RMB + 6,200 RMB



SWRG: Signature Work Research Grant

Support for approved supplies and non-durable equipment goods (limited exceptions). Can pay research participants for IRB-approved studies.

支持已批准的用品和非耐用设备物品（有限的例外情况）。可以支付经IRB批准的研究参与者。

Student prepares proposal and applies directly to the program

Needs Letter of Recommendation

Can fund supplies, expendables, and pay research participants

Equipment is only funded in exceptional cases; no books!

Requires Report AND Poster Session in Fall

SF: Signature Fund Supplemental Grants

Generous donations from parents of DKU students to further support student research, can supplement SELF and SWRG.

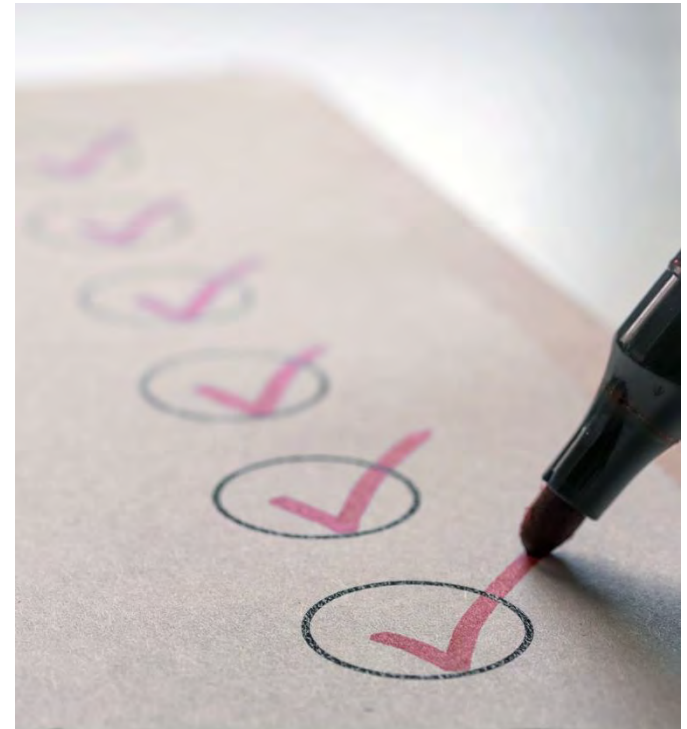


- Competitive Program!
- Student Applies
- Funding to help defray research expenses associated with SW project
- Project might be student independent idea or related to faculty research.
- Academic year or summer.
- Expenses up to 3250 RMB (+6750 RMB)



Eligibility for SWRG

- Approved SWPP (+IRB)
- Recommendation from SW Mentor
- Enrolled in Capstone (during year)
- A well prepared budget is required!
- Yes: disposable items, reagents, consumables, subscription software or services, fieldwork expenses, survey participant compensation.
- Equipment is rarely funded, and becomes property of DKU.
- No: books or permanent software or generic computer hardware.
- No: food or housing or stipend or travel.
- No: conference or publication fees.

SWRG timeline and funding cycle

- **Mid-September: Fall Application Deadline**
- **Mid-October:** Fall awards announced
- **December 15:** 6-month receipt cycle!
- **Mid-January:** Spring application deadline
- **Mid-February:** Spring awards announced
- **April 15:** Graduating senior receipts due!
- **Mid-May:** Summer application deadline
- **Early June:** Summer awards announced
- **June 15:** 6-month receipt cycle!





Funding Timelines

- **Mid-December:** CFP to FACULTY
- **Mid-January:** Faculty application deadline
- **Mid-February:** Faculty awards announced, students apply directly to FACULTY, who nominate students
- **Mid-March:** Student award letters on rolling basis
- **Late March:** Faculty nominations for students due
- **Late April:** Student commitment for summer housing
- **Residence Life decides when dorms can be occupied: expect it to be from June 1 to July 31.**

- **Mid-March:** Call for Proposals
- **Mid-April:** Application Deadline
- **Mid-April:** Awards Announced
- **June 15:** 6-month receipt cycle!

1. SECOND READER REVIEW

SECOND READER'S ROLE

Second Readers are faculty in related field assigned by Division Chairs

After receiving SW Products, **2 weeks** to offer edits and determine:

- **Adequate** to minimum academic standards and qualified for Distinction
- **Adequate** to minimum academic standards
- **Inadequate** to minimum academic standards

INADEQUATE SW

SW Products judged Inadequate will go back to students for **2 weeks of revision**

Second Reader will again determine **Adequate** or **Inadequate**

COMMITTEE'S FINAL JUDGMENT

SW Projects still judged Inadequate or with no edits by deadline will go to committee assembled and headed by VCAA

After reviewing work, committee empowered to **change Capstone 496 grade to “F”**

2. 2+2+4 CAPSTONE

NEW CAPSTONE MODEL

All students must take 8 credits of
Capstones (495 & 496) by end of Session 3
senior year

- 4+4 in senior year
- 2+2+4 with *up to* 2 credits in spring junior year

PROS, CONS, CAUTIONS

Pros

- Added flexibility, responsiveness to certain kinds of projects
- Less trouble with required courses

Cons

- Danger of discontinuous project work
- Danger of 2-credits overwhelmed by other 8

Cautions

- Students wanting to register in spring junior year must have mentor and RCR

3. GRADING

NO MORE "Z" GRADE

Capstones now graded individually,
including 2-credit capstones

Grades for Capstone 495 should be based
on student's **process** – what they've done

Opportunity to use grade as wake-up call
for students not demonstrating consistent
work

CAPSTONE 496 GRADES

Capstone 496 grade based on SW **product**
(paper etc.)

Submitted to SW Office at end of Session 3
(even for students taking 496 in Session 2)

LATE SUBMISSION PENALTY

Late final papers are **not eligible for Distinction**

SW Office/Registrar automatically reduces grades:

- By 10 pts (1 full letter grade) after first 7 days
- By 10 pts (1 full letter grade) after each subsequent 5 day period

On day 22 papers not submitted receive an automatic “F”

2 MODELS

1. Scholarly Projects

a) 25-30 page Academic Paper

2. Creative/Design Projects

a) Primary Object (artwork, business model, policy paper, app, etc.)

b) 15-20 page formal Explanatory Text (background, procedures, outcomes)

6. PROPOSAL

ONE SIMPLE FORM

SW Proposal is short and incorporates
RCR and Mentor Agreement (just
signature)

Mentors asked to note IRB/IACUC needs

7. NARRATIVE + REFLECTION

ONE ESSAY

SW Paper (25-30 pages) or Explanatory
Text (15-20 pages) to incorporate shorter
Reflection section
