Signature Work Standards for Ethics and Leadership/Philosophy Division of Arts and Humanities

I. Referencing Style

Signature Work proposals in Ethics and Leadership/Philosophy should consistently employ one referencing style, as should the final Signature Work papers. Various referencing styles are common in philosophy. Students should choose a style that is appropriate to their project. Mentors can provide advice where needed. Example referencing styles include:

- -Chicago Notes and Bibliography
- -Chicago Author-Date
- -MLA
- -APA
- -Harvard

II. Bibliography

Signature Work proposals must cite at least <u>five</u> sources in the bibliography. The final Signature Work paper must cite at least <u>ten</u> sources in the bibliography. The bibliographic formatting should adhere to the referencing style chosen for the project. Any source listed in the bibliography must be cited somewhere in the text.

III. Writing Quality

Signature Work proposals and final papers should be clearly written and organized. Students should thoroughly proof-read both before submission, checking for any significant formatting or grammatical deficiencies.
