What is Signature Work?



Large, individually-designed project that DKU students plan in Junior year and finish in Senior year – like a senior thesis.





- Graduation requirement for all undergraduates in China
- Students choose and work closely with one (or two) DKU faculty Mentors
- Students can do group projects
- Either Scholarly (academic paper) or Creative/Design (non-academic product
- + explanatory text)
- Completed over 8-credits of Capstone courses (mostly) taken in senior year
- Final products submitted before Session 4, inc. poster & video
- Students present during Signature Work Conference and Exhibition



What is Signature Work?

(P.2- P.3 SW Handbook)

Signature Work calls for all students to investigate one or more questions, problems, or issues that are of particular importance to themselves and to society. Students will engage with their SW project for much of their time at DKU. In their junior year, students begin to identify a topic connected to their major and a mentor in a related field. By the end of that year, they will write a formal proposal, supported by preliminary research and approved by their mentor, that lays out their aims and methodology. In their senior year, they conduct the bulk of their original research/work, write up their findings, and present them publicly to the university community. For many students, the SW process and product represent a major step toward their post-undergraduate careers.

Though SW projects vary considerably across fields and disciplines, all fall under one of two categories: scholarly and creative/design. Scholarly projects are broadly concerned with generating original academic research (in the natural or social sciences, humanities, etc.); their chief product is a 25-30 page research paper. Creative/Design projects are primarily centered around a substantial non-academic product – a work of art, a business model, a policy paper, etc. – which will also be accompanied by a formal written statement of 15-20 pages. These products, along with a poster and video presentation, will be submitted in the student's final session at DKU as their SW Portfolio. Grades will be assigned by SW mentors and will encompass both the portfolio components and the consistency, quality, and timeliness of the student's work with the mentor up to that point. A Second Reader Review ensures quality; students whose work does not meet MOE/JED standards will be required to submit revisions. Exceptional work may be nominated for SW Distinction, an academic honor bestowed at graduation.

In curricular terms, SW has two major components. First, students will identify three thematically-linked courses at DKU or Duke, drawing from their interdisciplinary courses, disciplinary courses, or electives. Second, students will take 8 credits of Capstone courses one-on-one with their mentor, during which they will complete much of the actual work of their SW projects.

Figure out your major first!

Once you've decided, begin asking yourself:

- 1) What kind of **project** related to my major that I want to work on?
- 2) What **3 (thematic) courses** at DKU or Duke might help me learn the background/methodologies/etc. I will need?
- 3) What DKU faculty member (**mentor**) works in my field? How can we get to know each other?





Your main task for this year is the SW Project Proposal.

Consider the following points:

- 1. What is the focus of my SW project? What is my research direction, methodology, and bibliography?
- 2. Does my research require approval from an Institutional Review Board (IRB) or the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC)?
- 3. When should I enroll in my Capstone Courses? What objectives should I accomplish during these two Capstone courses?
- 4. Develop a plan for expected progress, including deadlines, regular check-ins with my future mentors, and so on...

Update on Signature Work

No more E-portfolio component

You ONLY need to complete the Formstack final submission survey to fulfill the submission requirements.

Update on Signature Work

Draft Deadline

It is now an official requirement to submit a **full draft** of your SW products to your mentor **two weeks** before the final deadline.

Update on Signature Work

Spacing Correction

The line spacing in your SW should be **2.0**, not 1.5 as was suggested in some places in the Handbook



IRB (Institutional Review Boards) /IACUC (Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee) If your research:

- Involves generalizable data collected from human subjects (i.e. via surveys)
- Involves physically interacting with vertebrate animals

You **must** apply for and receive IRB/IACUC approval **before** you begin collecting data





<u>FAQ</u>

Q: Does my SW have to be connected to my major?

A: We encourage students to think interdisciplinarity, but SW has to have *some* connection to major. You should be using some of the skills – the disciplinary methodology – you have learned as part of your coursework.





FAQ

Q: Does my mentor have to be in my major?

A: DKU faculty aren't actually "in" majors, so no. Any faculty member who you think would be an appropriate fit is fair game.





FAQ

Q: Can I use material that I wrote for another class / already published as my SW project?

A: All students are required to take 8 credits of Capstones – two full classes worth of time. (UG studies says each 4-credit class should involve an average of 20 hours of work per week in and out of the classroom.) Students are expected to *use* that time to work on the SW.

So preexisting materials can be *incorporated* into the SW project but should be significantly altered or expanded.

SRS: Summer Research Scholars

Research stipends for students to engage in a collaborative summer research project with a faculty mentor.

SWRG: Signature Work Research Grant

Support for approved supplies and non-durable equipment goods (limited exceptions). Can fund travel and accommodations. Can pay research participants for IRB-approved studies.

SF: Signature Fund Supplemental Grants

Generous donations from parents of DKU students to further support student research, can supplement SWRG, with same restrictions. SF is reserved for unique, truly exceptional projects and proposals.



More Details on the SWRG



- Competitive Program!
- Student Applies
- Funding to help defray research expenses associated with SW project
- Project might be student independent idea or related to faculty research.
- Academic year or summer.
- Expenses up to 3250 RMB (+6750 RMB)





Eligibility for SWRG

- Approved SWPP (+IRB)
- Recommendation from SW Mentor
- Enrolled in Capstone (during year)
- A well prepared budget is required!
- Yes: disposable items, reagents, consumables, subscription software or services, fieldwork expenses, survey participant compensation.
- Equipment is rarely funded, and becomes property of DKU.
- No: books or permanent software or generic computer hardware.
- No: food or stipend or salaries.
- No: conference or publication fees.







Funding Categories (New Possibilities!)

Probably Allowed!

- Nondurable research supplies, special reagents not found in DKU labs, and single-use (or limiteduse) testing kits.
- Participant payments (with IRB), subject to DKU institutional limits. IRB approval must happen before the expense, or it will not be reimbursable.
- Research animal expenses, which could include animal purchase, care.
- Special software/cloud/GPU (with clear justification).
- Travel expenses to conduct necessary on-site research, subject to DKU institutional limits.
- Accommodation expenses to conduct necessary on-site research, subject to DKU institutional limits.
- Special materials for creative projects, which could include fabric, photographic film, 3-D printing material. Semipermanent creative projects funded by SWRG would become property of DKU after the exhibit.
- Funding equipment would require showing that you have exhausted all alternatives!

Excluded!

- Most small equipment items are excluded, such as personal items, laptops, cameras, books, or other electronics.
- Training or classes are excluded. This exclusion also applies ot online courses.
- Support for participation in an internship is excluded.
- Salaries, or payments of any kind, are excluded.
- Travel to attend conferences is excluded.
 Academic Services has a separate fund for travel to present at a conference.
- **Publication costs are excluded**, for research papers or for other materials.
- Off-campus space rental for exhibitions are excluded!
- On-campus housing or Kunshan area housing is excluded.
- Travel or housing to any location that the student would be going to anyway is excluded; this also excludes travel to the student's home.

SWRG timeline and funding cycle

- Mid-September: Fall Application Deadline
- Mid-October: Fall awards announced
- December 15: 6-month receipt cycle!
- Mid-January: Spring application deadline
- Mid-February: Spring awards announced
- April 15: Graduating senior receipts due!
- Mid-May: Summer application deadline
- Mid-June: Summer awards announced
- June 15: 6-month receipt cycle!









Funding Timelines

SRS & SF

- Mid-December: CFP to FACULTY
- Mid-January: Faculty application deadline
- Mid-February: Faculty awards announced, students apply directly to FACULTY, who nominate students
- Mid-March: Student award letters on rolling basis
- Late March: Faculty nominations for students due
- Late April: Student commitment for summer housing
- Residence Life decides when dorms can be occupied: expect it to be from Graduation to Mid-July.

Conferences

- First of Month: Complete proposals evaluated
- End of Cycle: when money runs out
- Need to Process Reimbursements
 Rapidly: read the agreement
 carefully, and turn your fapiao in, or
 the funds will be reallocated!
- We Do Check for the legitimacy of conference, as well as clear evidence that you are presenting a paper!
- Summer Schools are not conferences!
